

Hundreds gathered at Patriots Park in Coventry on Saturday, November 4th, for the 8th annual CT Veterans Day Race organized by MCL Det 40 member, Peter DePaola. The Park was full of



excitement, energy and patriotism with nearly 300 participants registered for either the 4-mile race, 3-mile walk, or 3-mile rucksack on a perfect autumn day. One of the motivating participants was our MCL Department of CT Commandant. Pat McMahon.


"This is more than just a road race. The event honors the service and sacrifice of Connecticut's many veterans. It's an event to welcome them home and honor their service and sacrifice, as well as to share with the CT community some of the many services available to them through various Veteran Service Organizations." said Peter DePaola, Race Director.

The opening ceremony was

patriotic and motivating with the UConn Air Force ROTC providing the color guard followed by Rubyfruit A Cappella Choir, also from UConn performing the National Anthem. Colchester resident, James DePaola, Marine GWOT veteran, offered the invocation. Special remarks were provided by CT Dept. of Veterans Affairs Deputy Commissioner Joe Danao. A new addition to the ceremony this year was Tom Callinan, a MCL member and Vietnam era veteran, who sang a song he wrote, "Some Gave All, All Gave Some."

Students from the UConn Crew Team, the Natchaug River Young Marines, and the Coventry High School National Honor Society all volunteered to make the day a huge success. Additionally, activeduty Marines and Soldiers proudly set up their static displays in the park and enjoyed sharing their stories and knowledge with over 500 guests in Patriots Park. The park was filled with esprit de corps throughout the morning.

Since the race began in 2016, near-




